# AN OPEN LETTER FROM THE HOMESTEAD

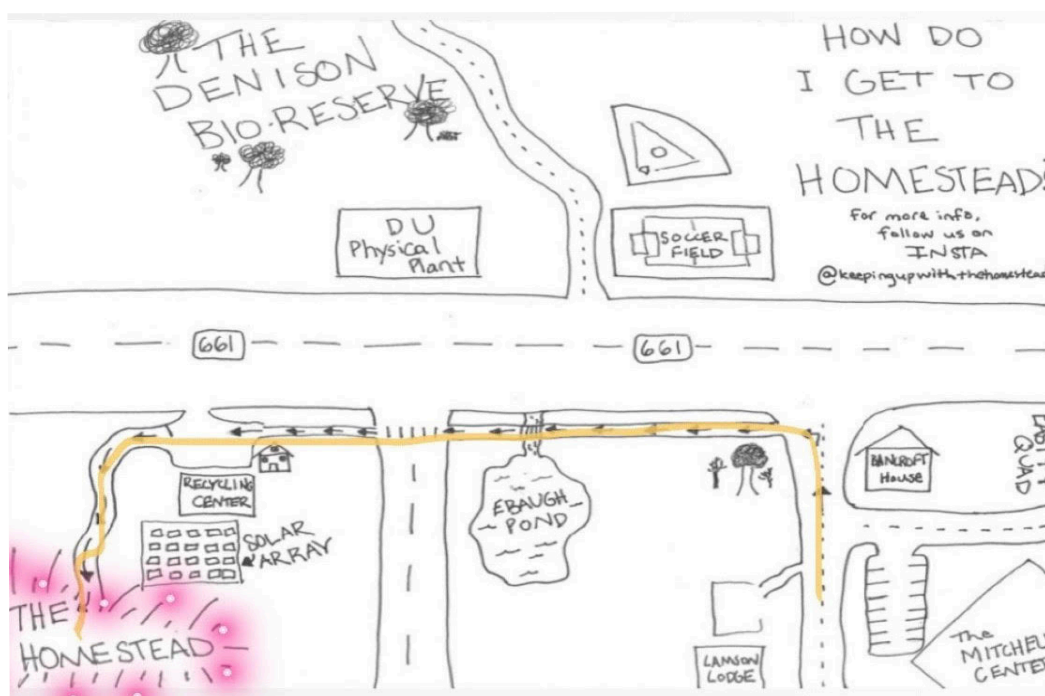
